Dear Resident,

I'm pleased to inform you that Council has re-opened an additional 2kms of the Coastal Walkway on schedule.

The only sections that remain closed are Kurnabinna and Grey Road gullies in Hallett Cove. Diversions are in place around these areas.

In November 2019, Council endorsed a \$4.8 million plan to investigate and potentially rebuild these gullies and connect the walkway between Heron Way and the Field River.

We have committed \$2.44 million towards the plan and are seeking State Government funding of a matching amount.

We have worked to repair the boardwalk since closing 2.5kms of the 8km structure as a safety precaution in June last year.

Work has included geotechnical investigations, assessing the condition of about 560 footings, installing new timber bracing and inserting metal rods to improve stability.

Additionally, Council has developed a long-term plan to completely rebuild the structure for an estimated \$14.5 million over 10 years.

The map on the reverse of this letter shows all the sections that are now open.

We will continue to keep you updated.

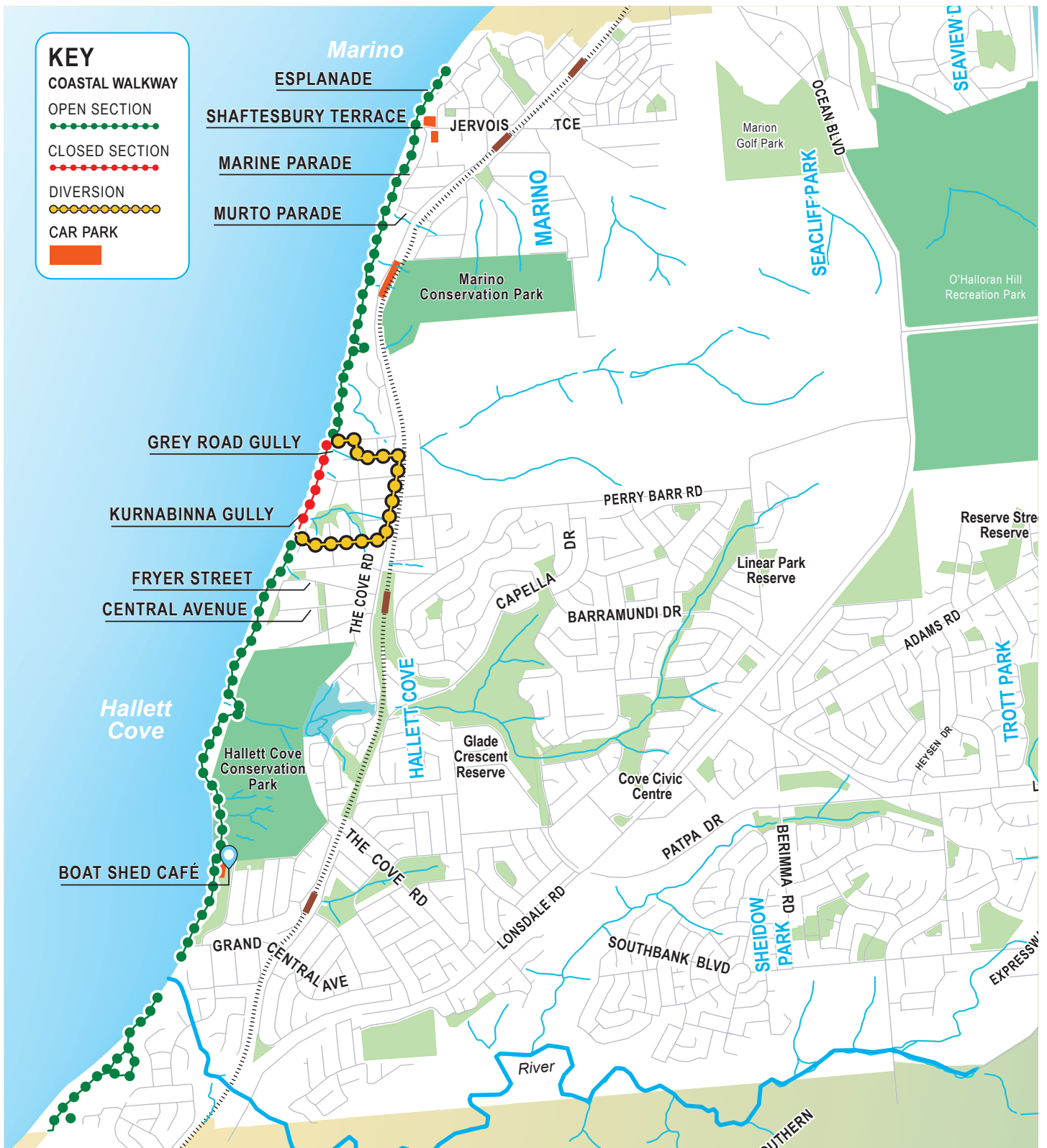
