

Concert at the Cove General FAQ's

Name: Concert at the Cove
Date: Saturday 24 November
Time: 5 pm to 9 pm
Location: Heron Way Reserve – Hallett Cove

A free family-friendly music themed event which includes live music, entertainment for children, food trucks, come and try activities and dance demonstrations.

What can I bring to Concert at the Cove?

- A sense of fun! And your inner rock star.
- Bring sunscreen & a hat. Please note: there is limited sheltered area – come prepared for rain or shine
- Picnic rugs and low chairs as it is sloping site.

Can I bring the kids?

- Yes! Concert at the Cove is a family-friendly event

Is the event free?

- Yes all performances, come and try activities, and children's craft is free.
- There is food and refreshments for purchase
- The Record Shop will have records for sale or swap.

Can I book in for any of the activities?

- No bookings are required.
- Spots are secured on a first come, first secure basis.

Where can I park?

- Limited parking will be available on Grand Central Avenue and Dutchman Drive.
- Vehicles with disability access stickers will be able to access parking spaces along Heron Way Reserve right of the roundabout.
- Street parking is available at the Hallett Cove Beach train stations either accessed via Cherub Street or Gretel Crescent.
- Parking is also available on The Cove Road and surrounding streets in the Hallett Cove area. Follow the signage to the event, or ask customer service staff who will be roving up and down The Cove Road.
- Guests parked in the side streets can access the free community shuttle which picks up from The Cove Road opposite Pavana Reserve, and also from the Hallett Cove Beach Train Station on the western side.
- Guests parking on the eastern side of the train line can access the walk-way tunnel from the train station. This will bring you out to the beach side of the train station, follow signage to the event which is a 15 minute walk, or catch the free shuttle (see Parking Suggestions below).
- Local residents will have access to their homes.
- Boatshed café guests will have access to the venue.

What public transport services can I use to attend the event?

- Train: Hallett Cove Beach Railway Station is on the Seaford line and is a five minute walk from Heron Way Reserve
- Bus: Route/Number 683 – Stop 58 Dutchman Drive South & North side – 3 minute walk
- Bus: Route/Number 683 – Stop 60 St Vincent Street West side – 6 minute walk

Bicycle parking

- Bicycle stands will be available onsite.
- Bike owners must use their own locks to secure bikes.

Is First Aid available?

- Yes. St John Ambulance will be on site. Please ask Security, Event staff or First Aid officers for help. Please consider others as well as your own safety. If someone is in need of medical attention please let Security, Event staff or First Aid officers know so they can help.

Nearest ATM

- The nearest ATM's to the event site are at the Hallett Cove Shopping centre located at 246 Lonsdale Road, Hallett Cove.

What if it rains?

- If it does rain the show will go ahead unless conditions are deemed to be dangerous. If the forecast is for even the possibility of rain bring good quality rain coats and suitable footwear. In the event of inclement weather patrons should check our website BEFORE departing for the concert for messages regarding traffic, parking or extreme heat or wet weather arrangements. marion.sa.gov.au/concert-at-the-cove

Are there facilities for disabled people?

- Yes. Disabled toilets & parking are available
- Parking: disabled parking will be available along Heron Way
- Toilets: disabled access toilets are located in the main toilet area on site
- Food catering, main stage area, children's craft area are on a flat hard surface. Other activities are on grass.

Where is Lost Property?

- If you find or lose something - please go to the City of Marion information stand which is located at the event next to the memorial wall at Hallett Cove up to 9pm on Saturday 24 November. After the event, any lost property (which is non-perishable) will be stored at the City of Marion Administration Building at 245 Sturt Road, Sturt up to the close of business, 5pm on Thursday, 29 November. Please pop in or call to check if you item has been handed in.
- All valuable items (eg: keys, phones) not claimed by 5pm on Thursday, 29 November will be handed to SA Police.

- Any items of good quality (eg: clothing) not claimed by 5pm on Thursday, 29 November will be placed in the St Vinnie's donation box in the Administration Centre.
- All other items will be disposed of as required.

Lost people

- Lost people are to be reported at the City of Marion information stand which is located at the event next to the memorial wall.
- PA announcements and onsite communication tools will be used to re-unite guests.

What are the food options onsite?

- You are permitted to bring your own food to the event.
- This is a Fork on the Road activity so there will be a broad offering of food and cuisines from Fork on the Road food truck vendors available during the event.

Alcohol

- Alcohol will not be sold on site at the event.

Will drinking water be available on site?

- Bring along your own water bottle and fill up at the water fountain which is located near the fitness equipment and playground.

Can I bring my dog?

- Dogs are welcome but they must be on a lead at all times during the event and while on the event site. All dogs must be under effective control.
