Nikki, who created the comic on vaping, received a \$250 EFTPOS voucher as second prize and a \$125 Eftpos Voucher was presented to Kaitlyn, a First Nations young person who is passionate about drawing and painting.

Passion Projects is a competition instigated by the City of Marion to encourage young people to share their passions via a variety of mediums, whether that is video, photo or even a poem.

The competition started in the middle of the first COVID lockdown in 2020 as a way for young people to stay connected with the City of Marion community.
