City of Marion Census data

According to 2021 Census data, 29.1 per cent of residents in the City of Marion were born overseas and more than 20 per cent speak a language other than English at home.

The three largest ancestries in the City of Marion in 2021 were English, Australian and Scottish. Around 1.2 per cent of the population are Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and the top languages other an English spoken in Marion were — Mandarin (3.1%), Napali (1.8%), Punjabi (1.2%), Greek (1.1%), Arabic (1.1%), Cantonese (0.9%), Hindi (0.9%), Filipino/Tagalog (0.9%), Italian (0.7%), Spanish (0.6%).
