# STATE BUDGET 2016-17: \$2 million for UCI BMX track in Adelaide's South

The State Government will invest \$2 million to build a Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) standard BMX track in O'Halloran Hill, in a bid to support our international-level riders and attract major events to South Australia.

The Marion and Onkaparinga councils have agreed in principle to commit up to \$750,000 each towards the track, which would be built on Majors Rd, subject to development of the final project scope and budget.

#### Background

BMX participation in South Australia has doubled in the last five years with about half the riders from the southern suburbs.

The Cove BMX Club has 168 members and Happy Valley BMX Club has about 150 members.

Currently South Australia does not have any UCI standard BMX facilities and can't attract national-level BMX events. The UCI is the international body that governs competitive cycling for all disciplines.

Without having a UCI BMX track in SA, riders have had to move interstate in order to further develop their skills and progress towards elite pathways.

The land at Majors Road is currently owned by the State Government. The site was chosen because it provides a suitable noise buffer from the surrounding residential area.
