Long-serving CEO resigns

Long-serving chief executive officer Mark Searle has resigned, proudly leaving the City of Marion in a better position than when he arrived nearly 15 years ago.

A special general council meeting was held last night to consider the resignation, which will occur on March 27.

Mayor Kris Hanna said: "On behalf of Council, I sincerely thank Mark for what has been a remarkable era of achievement for Marion".

Among Mr Searle's significant achievements are:

- Harnessing staff, council and other resources to obtain a commitment from the State and Federal Governments to build the SA Aquatic and Leisure Centre and the GP Plus. A total investment of \$140 million for a \$12.5 million contribution from council.
- In the south, there has been the construction of the Patpa Drive, the redevelopment of the Hallett Cove Shopping Centre, the Boatshed Cafe and the soon to be completed Cove Civic Centre. A total investment of more than \$100 million for a \$15 million contribution from council
- Working with the State Government to develop the Tonsley site. A \$1 billion investment.
- Smaller projects such as the Rajah Street Reserve and the Marion Historic Village.

Mr Hanna said winning the 2010 Gold Business Excellence Award and the 2013 Australasian and Australian Awards for Community Engagement for the development of council's strategic plan were testimony to Mr Searle's leadership.

"A key part of the City of Marion's success is its culture and leadership and Mark has transformed both," Mr Hanna said.

"Our internal auditors have observed that the City of Marion seems to be achieving more with less compared with other councils."

Mr Searle said he adored local government and the City of Marion community but it was time for a change.

"I have been talking with the Mayor since late last year about my plans. I felt ready for a change and torn by my commitment to Marion," Mr Searle said.

"The timing is good for council with a new Mayor and seven new Elected Members. It is also good for me.
