1 THE BIG THAW

The two half-court ground artworks sit between a mural, a data source and a functional play space. Looking to the importance of maintaining our waterways and caring for our environment.

Influenced by the importance of water capture, use and conservation, this artwork, reflects on the arguable practice of water divining and hopes to spark discussion and thoughts on conservation, sustainability and an appreciation of our local ecosystems.

The mural offers a glimpse of flora and fauna life from above and below the surface, including Glossy Ibis, Turtle, Yabbie, Red Gum, Kangaroo and Purple Spotted Gudgeon.



1 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

River red gums are often found along creeks, rivers or on floodplains.



2 EUROPEAN OLIVE

Olea europaea

This gnarly tree was part of the Oaklands Homestead from the mid 1840's.

Quercus robur

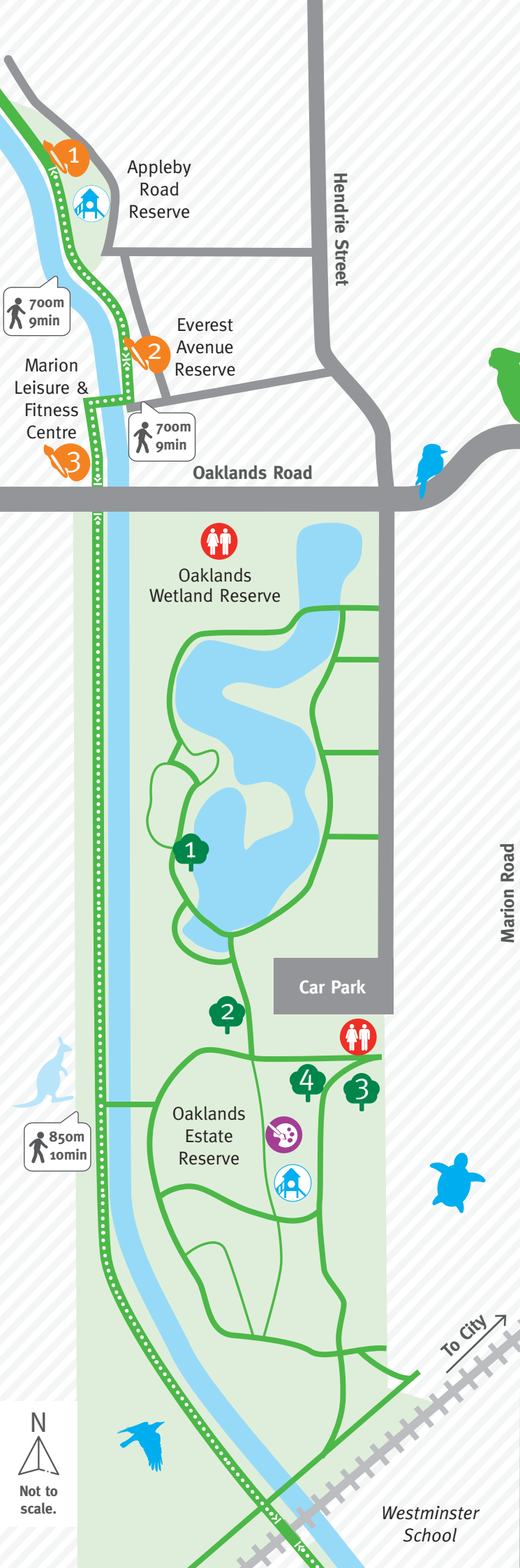
Enjoy the cool shade on the bench, under the tree.

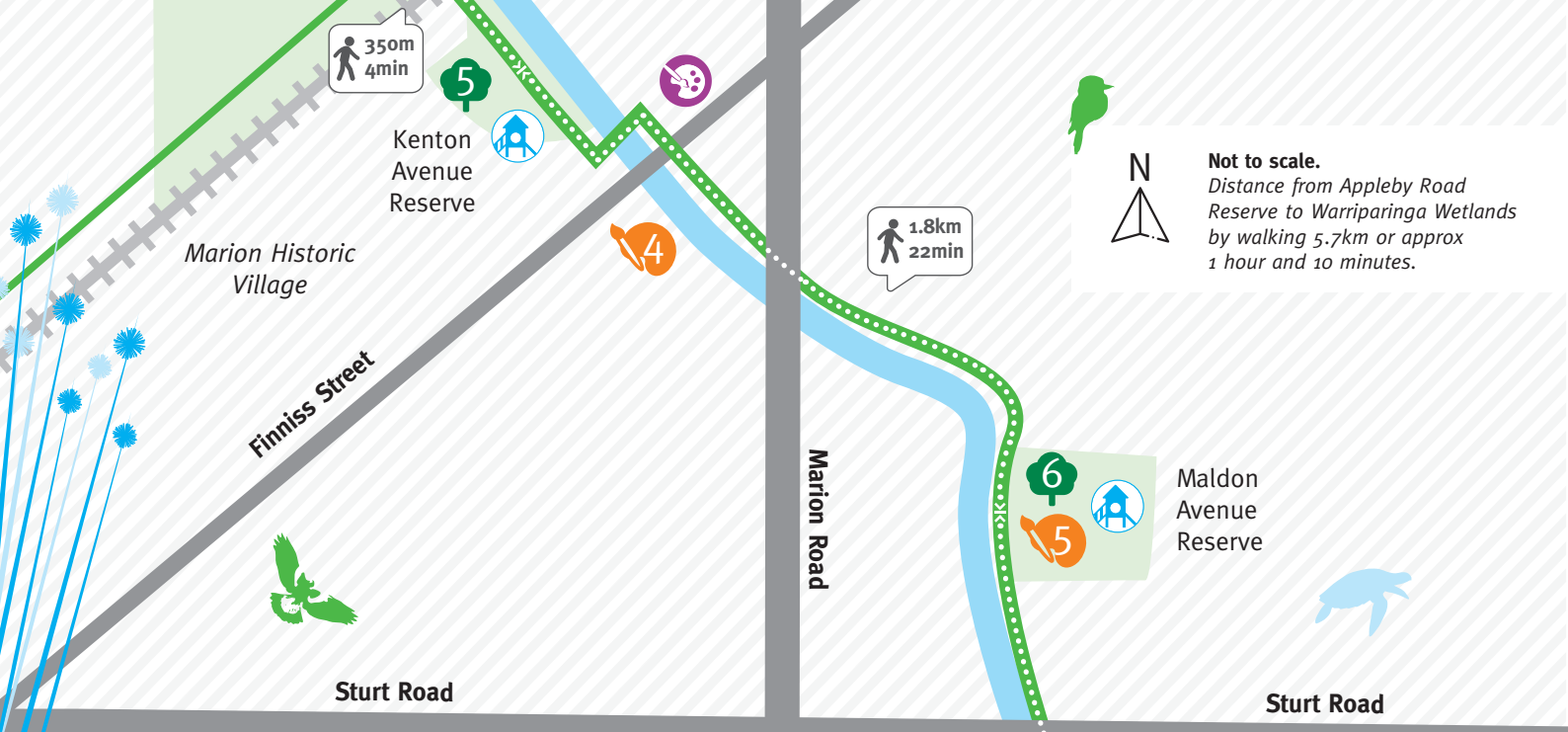


4 CANARY ISLAND PINE

4 BIRDS OF THE FLOOD PLAIN

Ink and Ruby Studios

This mural features a Sulphur-Crested Cockatoo, Royal Spoonbill, Kookaburra, and native plants – the Correa, Knobby Club Rush, Eutaxia Diffusa, Golden Wattle and Eucalyptus leaves.

5 PLASTRON

James Stewart

Fun and playful, this artwork stands 1.5 metres high, symbolises a delicately balanced ecosystem and sustainability of amazing creatures such as turtles to their natural habitat.

5 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

Be amazed by this 250 year old fauna hotel.

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

Beautiful white flowers from late spring to mid-summer.

7 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

See the Coolamon scar cut from the tree by Kurna people.

8 BLUE ATLAS CEDAR

Cedrus atlantica glauca

Native to the mountains of Morocco and Algeria.

9 ENGLISH OAK

Quercus robur

Can live for more than 700 years.

10 LONDON PLANE TREE

Platanus acerifolia

Fuzzy rounded fruiting balls turn from green to brown when ripe.
