

INLET POND

Cleans the water by allowing heavy particles to sink to the bottom.



ISLAND

Take time out for a picnic and enjoy a great view.



STEPPING STONES AND WEIR

The weirs keep water at the proper levels in the ponds. Oxygen is added when water flows over the rim and the stepping stones are a great way to cross the wetland.



WAVY BRIDGE

Connects the recreation plaza to the biodiversity corridor which is set to be planted with local plant species.



VIEWING PLATFORM

Provides uninterrupted views looking north over the wetland.



BRIDGE AND WEIR

Connects to the island while the weir helps maintain water levels.

OAKLANDS WETLAND PARTNERS

The wetland cost more than \$9 million with the City of Marion and the Adelaide and Mount Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Management Board each contributing \$2.66 million. The Australian Government provided \$3.73 million through the Water for the Future initiative.

Aquatic plants in the pond help provide a final clean of the water prior to injection into the aquifer for storage and later distribution via pipelines to reserves.
