REPORT OBJECTIVE

- To provide an update on the progress of the Sam Willoughby BMX (SWBMX) & Southern Soccer Facility (SSF) projects.
- To provide an update on the damage to the SWBMX Facility which occurred during the Opening Event held on 22 and 23 January 2022.
- To seek approval for additional project funding for both projects.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The SWBMX and SSF projects are progressing and now nearing completion. The SSF project has had approximately 12 weeks of COVID and supply related delays, and the revised estimated date for completion is 24 March 2022. This will be in time for the opening event scheduled for 9 April 2022. Pitches 1 and 2 will be fully established by then, and pitch 3 will be established late May.

The SWBMX project achieved Practical Completion on 14 January 2022, noting some outstanding works. The planned Auscycling opening event was held on 22 and 23 January 2022, unfortunately during torrential rain which resulted in significant site and track damage. This report makes early



comment on liability for the damage and notes that a formal report on liability will be brought to Council in about 3-4 weeks' time. An insurance claim for the damage has been lodged.

The project budget, including all contingencies, is currently exceeded, and significant additional costs have also been identified. Additional costs include BMX track design changes requested by UCI, costs associated with the BMX National's Event, improvements to the SSF stormwater management design following review by the Engineer and DEW, public safety improvements to the SSF fencing surrounding the stormwater detention basis, additional consultant fees due to the 12 week delay to the SSF program, and costs thought to be included within the original budget but which have not been. In total these additional costs are \$380,746 for the SWBMX project and \$238,250 for the SSF project. This report seeks approval for a corresponding increase in project budget.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Notes the progress of the Sam Willoughby BMX and Southern Soccer Facility projects.
- 2. Endorses the approach to rectifying the damage to the SWBMX Facility which occurred during the Opening Event held on 22 and 23 January 2022, including investigations and determinations with respect to apportionment of liabilities.
- 3. Approves additional funding of \$380,746 for the SWBMX Project, allocated through Council's 2021/2022 3rd Budget Review process, noting this includes key items such as:
 - a. BMX Track Design Changes requested by UCI
 - b. Costs associated with the BMX National's Event
 - c. Costs thought to be included within the original budget.
- 4. Approves additional funding of \$238,250 for the SSF Project, allocated through Council's 2021/2022 3rd Budget Review process, noting this includes key items such as:
 - a. Improvements to the stormwater management design following review by the Engineer and DEW
 - b. Public safety improvements to the fencing surrounding the stormwater detention basis
 - c. Additional consultant fees due to the 12 week delay to program
 - d. Costs thought to be included within the original budget.
- 5. Notes that any acceptance of liability by contractor(s) and/or proceeds from a current insurance claim may reduce the financial impact on Council.
- 6. In accordance with Section 91(7) and (9) of the Local Government Act 1999 the Council orders that this report, SWBMX and Southern Soccer Facility Project Updates, any appendices and the minutes arising from this report having been considered in confidence under Section 90(2) and (3)(b) of the Act, except when required to effect or comply with Council's resolution(s) regarding this matter, be kept confidential and not available for public inspection for a period of 12 months from the date of this meeting. This confidentiality order will be reviewed at the General Council Meeting in December 2022.

PROJECT OVERVIEW



Project Funding

Construction Contract

Partek Construction & Interiors (Partek) was engaged as the Principal Contractor for SWBMX and SSF. The contract was executed on 12 March 2021.

SWBMX PROJECT (Separable Portion 1)

Overview

The SWBMX facility involves the construction of a Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) grade BMX facility incorporating a BMX track, two starting ramps, gates, and race timing system, sports lighting systems, public address system, staging areas, toilets, and site fencing.

Also included are utilities augmentation works (electrical, water, sewer, stormwater, communications), associated civil works including landscaping, car parking, spectator viewing areas and space for food and beverage vendors. Additionally, a multipurpose building to accommodate race officials, first aid, club rooms, event space storage and catering provisions has been constructed.

Program

Partek were given Site Possession on 15 March 2021 and Practical Completion was forecast to be 16 December 2021.

Due to COVID 19 and inclement weather-related delays, the Superintendent issued the Certificate of Practical Completion for the SWBMX Project (Separable Portion 1) on 14 January 2022. The Certificate of Practical Completion is included in Attachment 1.

As per the program overview above, the completion of the SWBMX facility occurred approximately 4 weeks later than the original date within the contract. These delays were largely attributable to the site's exposure / susceptibility to inclement weather (extremely wet winter) and the availability of interstate labour for the track construction as a result of COVID 19 border restrictions.

While the deadline of the opening event placed the team under pressure, it did not adversely impact the quality of completed work and did not have any bearing on the issuing of the Certificate of Practical Completion.

Cost

City of Marion, Rider Levett Bucknall and Turner & Townsend have worked closely throughout the project to manage and monitor budget. RLB present their monthly Financial Report to Council staff and regular meetings to identify cost risks are held to ensure adequate contingency is quarantined and correctly estimated.

As a result of several significant and unforeseen variations which were tabled by the Head Contractor during January 2022 and in the lead-up to the SWBMX opening event, the contingency was committed and RLB has since forecast it will be exceeded. RLB has recommended additional contingency will be required to complete both projects.

Risks

There have been several risks arise throughout the project, however with the exception of those listed below, these have generally been mitigated with little or no impact to program.



The major risks which have impacted the project are:

- Inclement Weather: Due to the site's location and by virtue of the majority of works occurring outdoors, inclement weather caused the majority of delays on the project. This has been compounded by the wetter than average winter during 2021.
- COVID 19: Living Recreation was the subcontractor engaged by Partek to undertake the
 track construction. Given they were based in NSW the ongoing border restrictions imposed
 by the State Government as a result of COVID 19 were problematic in ensuring the
 continuity of work and continued progress of the track build.
- COVID 19 also impacted the ability for UCI representatives to attend the track during construction and whilst remote videoconference was used to demonstrate the design and test rides it was not seen in person until a UCI representative attended South Australia on 19 January 2022.
- Track Design and UCI Accreditation Process: The quality and accuracy of the track design was discussed many times throughout the project. Advice from Dirtz, Living Recreation and UCI was that the design provided by Dirtz was to be used as a guide and Living Recreation, in consultation with Sam Willoughby and UCI, would make considered amendments to the design as the build progressed and test riding was conducted. It is understood by CoM that this is common practice for BMX track design and construction and typical around the world. This process resulted in several approved changes to the track design which were awarded as Variations to Partek under their contract and completed prior to Practical Completion being awarded.

Track Construction

Key relevant track construction milestones / events include the following:

- 15 December 2021: UCI confirmed the track signoff and UCI accreditation process. It was accepted that while asphalting of the berms is a requirement to achieve UCI accreditation it was not a pre-requisite for hosting the National's Event. It was accepted the asphalting of the berms would only occur if favourable weather conditions permitted in the first 2 weeks of January 2022 which at the time was unknown. Favourable weather conditions required the temperature to be in excess of 30 degrees for the application of bitumen over a 6 day period. Favourable weather conditions did not occur in the lead-up to Practical Completion and the National's Event.
- 21 December 2021: it was agreed that video evidence would be sufficient to achieve track signoff. Given UCI was able to attend in person on 20.1.22 the signoff was delayed until this time so a proper inspection could be undertaken. Prior to attending the track in person, the UCI confirmed on 18.1.22 that, based on the videos and feedback from test riders, the track was complete and they were satisfied with the quality of track construction.
- 28 January 2022: Final UCI inspection report. The final UCI inspection report was issued a week after the National's Event. The report noted some minor alterations which needed to be made to improve track safety and UCI accreditation. It also noted additional changes which, while not a requirement for UCI accreditation, would make the track more desirable and ensure the facility would host large events. (Advice is that without undertaking these additional works then the SWBMX would not be selected for international events). This advice was consistent with the UCI Track Guide which advises that UCI comment/direction for changes to the track can be provided at any time.

SWBMX National's Event Summary

The below outlines the activities undertaken in the lead up to the National's Event on the 22nd & 23rd January, including timelines for when these occurred.



- Partek's contractual date for completion was extended to 20.1.22.
- During November and December 2021 numerous conversations between T&T, CoM and Partek occurred to interrogate their program and determine if the facility would be ready for the Event given Practical Completion was so close. The consistent advice from Partek was that they were working towards a target completion date of 14.1.22 and this should be achieved. Based on this advice, CoM confirmed to event organiser's (Auscycle and EventsSA) that the facility would be ready to host the National's Event.
- UCI confirmed a video assessment of the track during the week commencing 10.1.22 combined with an in person assessment on 19.1.22 would be sufficient to determine the suitability for hosting the National's Event. UCI confirmed they would complete their formal report and accreditation the week following the Nationals. Based on this advice it was understood, and accepted by CoM, that provided the UCI deem the track safe to ride on 19 January 2022 the National's Event would go ahead without a formal UCI accreditation being in place.
- Weather conditions during this time were not favourable and as such the asphalting of the
 berms did not occur. Given previous written advice from UCI in December 2021, this was
 accepted by CoM and the National's Event was still authorised to proceed. As a temporary
 measure, and prior to the Nationals, UCI advised the berms should be sealed with the same
 polymer as the main track wearing course. CoM authorised these works to proceed with
 costs to be submitted by Partek as a variation to the contract.
- On 14.1.22, T&T issued the Certificate of Practical Completion and site possession was transferred back to CoM. Annexure B of the Certificate listed the completion of the wearing course / polymer layer was still outstanding and was forecast for completion by 19.1.22. The Certificate noted that access to the track was not permitted until authorised by Partek. CoM and the BMX Clubs were notified and adhered to this requirement.
- On 18.1.22 UCI confirmed from the videos they had received and feedback from local delegates (South Australian International Commissaire & Technical Delegate) they have no issues with the track or the event going ahead. UCI did raise concern regarding the forecast inclement weather and the need for stringent crowd control to protect the track surrounds and minimise damage. UCI also advised given the limited time for curing of the track surface, foot traffic should be limited on the track.
- On 19.1.22 Partek, in consultation with Living Recreation and UCI, recommended that the track not be used until after 6pm on 20.1.22 to allow adequate curing time.
- In response to Partek's email and to a verbal discussion had onsite at 3:30 pm on 19.1.22,
 T&T re-confirmed in writing the 24 hour curing period required before the track can be used.
 T&T also noted Living Recreation's recommendation that walking on the track should be avoided wherever possible and for as long as possible before the event on the 22/23
 January. This advice was onforwarded by CoM to the BMX Clubs and other relevant parties.
- In response to T&T's clarifications mentioning 'after the minimum curing time the track will be in a suitable condition to be ridden without damage', Partek advised that whilst they "agree that the track can be ridden after the minimum curing time, it can still sustain damage. This would be the case moving forward generally regarding wear & tear when the track is used". Partek continued, "as outlined in my below email from yesterday, now that the track has been handed over to the end user (as of today 20/01/22) it is their responsibility to maintain it (including any damage caused by use) such is the nature of the product".
- Auscycle and the BMX Clubs conducted numerous races on the track in the 24-36 hours
 prior to the event and no damage or issues were reported. On Wednesday 19.1.22 the
 Clubs held a Club Members session for 2 hours to view the track only. Club officials
 welcomed people to the track and informed them that they needed to keep off the track but
 could visit the start hills and clubhouse. The Club Presidents and other Committee members



then kept advising people as they entered the site and they ushered people who got close to the track away from the track. CoM were present the entire session and saw no-one stand on the track. On Thursday 20.1.22 the Clubs held their first track ride. Club volunteers once again informed people that they were not allowed to stand on the track and they monitored the track. CoM were present for a large portion of that session and did not see any unauthorised entry onto the track. On Friday 21.1.22 AusCycling gained access to the site and track for bump-in and track riding all day. The site was being operated by AusCycling under their agreement with CoM and AusCycling was responsible for monitoring the track. CoM were at the facility on a few occasions that day and did not see any unauthorised access on the track.

- AusCycling was responsible for the event and the site under agreement with CoM. including monitoring pedestrian traffic on the track. CoM representatives were at the track on both Saturday and Sunday at intervals (2.5 hours Saturday afternoon and 1.5 hours on Sunday from 11am – 12:30pm). Feedback from CoM officials and both Club President's includes: The only access CoM saw on the track was from officials and the track maintenance crew. The track maintenance crew used outdoor brooms to sweep the water from the track. CoM spoke to both Club Presidents and they confirmed that this is a routine method used by Clubs to sweep water off their tracks. CoM asked both Club Presidents separately if they thought there was much unauthorised traffic on the track. Both stated that they did not think there was much pedestrian traffic except for the track officials and maintenance crew. The only time people did walk the track was at the conclusion of the event and some people wanted to see how bad the track had become. Between the two Club Presidents they were at the facility on every day of the event and the days leading up to the event. The Club Presidents mentioned that a person brought a kayak into the facility to place it in the water pooling between the first and second straight for a photo opportunity and then put it on the track. They do not believe anyone rode down the start hill or anywhere on the track on a kayak.
- Rainfall data over the opening weekend showed upwards of 25mm which is significant. Historically throughout the project the SWBMX and SSF sites received significantly more rainfall when compared to the nearest official BoM gauge and as such it is likely the rain experienced at the track was more than reported.
- The UCI guidelines make the following recommendations with regards to Track Maintenance after Construction, stating: Do not ride on the track when it is very wet; this will help prevent ruts from forming (Pg 14/18). If puddles appear on the track surface during rain, it is important not to sweep away the water. Let the puddle dry and if needed, cover the area with a little bit of spare surface material and pack it (Pg 14/18). [Clubs and officials were seen sweeping the track consistently on Saturday and Sunday causing further damage to the track surface]. Common damaged areas must be treated with special care; This is especially important in the period after the track is first built; the surface will continue to harden with use; however, after construction, the surface will be more susceptible to damage than usual.
- Post event, CoM has received verbal advice from Living Recreation that minor tears and damage to the wearing course is normal for BMX tracks however they believe the excessive rain, combined with high traffic and use of brooms, caused moisture to penetrate underneath the surface and cause widespread lifting.

Damage to the SWBMX Facility & Liabilities

Following completion of the National's Event a detailed audit, including photographs, was completed by Partek to confirm the extent of damage (Attachment 2).

As part of this it was acknowledged that in some localised areas ponding of water occurred due to insufficient gradients which did not meet the specification. Living Recreation has acknowledged these could be improved and has committed to doing so at no additional cost to Council (i.e. a



Outside of this the majority of damage relates to the delamination (separation) of the polymer from the basecourse underneath and surrounding infrastructure such as erosion of viewing mounds, clubhouse scratches, damaged signage, etc which are attributable to the large crowd numbers that attended.

The project team is still reviewing the audit to determine whether damage was caused as a result of the event or as a result of defective work by Partek. At this point in time a final determination has not yet been made however it would appear that outside of the delamination of the track, all other damage is a result of the event and is not considered a defect.

The delamination of the track requires further investigation before a determination can be made however there is a high likelihood the damage was caused, or exacerbated, as a result of the event occurring in such adverse weather conditions. At the very least the damage to the track would have been minimised if the event did not proceed on the Sunday as it was clear the conditions on Saturday were causing degradation of the track. This is also consistent with advice provided in the UCI racing guidelines, in particular pages 14 & 15.

Delamination of the berms appears to be the worst affected area and this was only ever a temporary surface before the asphalt went down.

Liability for the damage to the facility is anticipated to be fully determined over the coming 3-4 weeks.

For the purpose of the financial update below, the entire cost for all repairs has been included, however this may change following resolution of the investigations and apportionment of liability noted above.

The existing wearing course / polymer on the track has the potential to be salvaged and recycled as road seal by CoM to minimise environmental footprint of the project.

Financial - Forecast Variations

RLB has undertaken a review of forecast variations and risks remaining on the SWBMX project and provided the below itemised list, including estimated costs.

These have categorised these as follows:

- Category 1 = Latent (pre-existing) Conditions and Design Omissions
- Category 2 = Client Requested Changes
- Category 3 = Works to be funded out of existing OPEX Cost Centres

These are estimates only and costs may change (up or down) based upon formal submissions from Partek and assessments of the same by RLB.

Category 3 Works

Category 3 works include general maintenance / repairs to the SWBMX facility and clubrooms following the National's Event. These works include items such as painting, cleaning, replacement of a damaged downpipe, tidy up of viewing mounds and hydroseed, etc.


The estimated cost of these repairs is \$35,000. Council will fund these repairs from existing maintenance budgets.

Additional Funds Required

The Project currently has committed the entirety of its contingency which excludes any of the forecast variations listed above. It is recommended, at a minimum, additional funding of \$380,746 is provided to complete the Category 1 works.

Next Steps

The below timeline itemises the activities and recommended next steps to bring the SWBMX Project to Completion.





SOUTHERN SOCCER FACILITIES PROJECT (Separable Portion 2)

Overview

The Southern Soccer Facility involves the construction of three natural turf soccer pitches, irrigation system, sports lighting system, public address system, toilets and fencing. Also included are utilities augmentation works (electrical, water, sewer, stormwater, communications), associated civil works including landscaping, car parking and spectator viewing areas. A modular clubroom facility incorporating function space, first air room, change rooms, bar, canteen, and public amenities will be constructed.

Program

Partek was given Site Possession on 15^h March 2021 and contractual Practical Completion was 16 December 2021.

The current date for Practical Completion is 10 February 2022 however on the 28.1.22 Partek submitted an updated program in conjunction with 4 Extension of Time (EOT) claims. Partek's revised program indicates the Date for Practical Completion to be 24th March 2022, however the program and submitted EOT's are currently under assessment by the Superintendent. The EOT claims largely related to COVID19 related delays including reduced labour and material availability.

As per the program overview above, the Completion of the Southern Soccer Facility is running approximately 12 weeks later than the original date within the contract. These delays were largely attributable to the sites exposure / susceptibility to inclement weather (extremely wet winter) resulting in the inability to adequately prepare the pitch subgrade prior to completing irrigation and laying the turf.

COVID 19 related Labour shortages and the pressure on resources committed to the SWBMX opening event has also contributed to delays in the completion of the modular clubrooms.

Budget

City of Marion, RLB and T& have worked closely throughout the project to manage and monitor budget. RLB present their monthly Financial Report to Council and regular meetings to identify cost risks are held to ensure adequate contingency was quarantined and correctly estimated. As a result of several significant and unforeseen variations which occurred during January and in the lead-up to the SWBMX opening event the overall contingency was committed and RLB has since forecast it will be exceeded. RLB has recommended additional contingency will be required to complete both projects.

Risks

There have been a number of risks arise throughout the project, however with the exception of those listed below, these have generally been mitigated with little or no impact to program.

The major risks which have impacted the project are:

- Inclement Weather: Due to the site's location and by virtue of the large majority of works
 occurring outdoors, inclement weather caused the majority of delays on the project. This has
 been compounded by the wetter than average winter during 2021. In particular the wet
 weather created unworkable conditions for several months during the preparation of the
 subgrade for the soccer pitches which had knock on affects to completing the irrigation and
 turf install.
- COVID-19: The spike in COVID-19 cases which occurred over the 2021/22 Christmas period significantly reduced the number of workers onsite during January 2022. This was a critical month for Partek, with a number of major activities planned. In addition, there have



been some material delays relating to the irrigation pump which further delayed the establishment of the turf on the soccer pitches.

SWBMX Opening Event: In addition to the COVID-19 impacts on resourcing, the SWBMX
Opening Event which occurred on 22 and 23 January consumed a number of resources,
including Partek management, which detracted focus from completing the works on the
SSF. Whilst these delays are hard to quantify and are not claimable under the Contract it
should be acknowledged that the opening event did contribute to the current delays.

Financial - Forecast Variations

RLB has undertaken a review of forecast variations and risks remaining on the SSF project and provided the below itemised list, including estimated costs.

These are categorised these as follows:

- Category 1 = Latent Conditions and Design Omissions
- Category 2 = Client Requested Changes
- Category 3 = Works to be funded out of existing OPEX Cost Centres

These are estimates only and costs may change (up or down) based upon formal submissions from Partek and assessments of the same by RLB.

Category 2 Works

Category 2 Works include an allowance for club requested changes. These works are not yet known however may include items such as additional furniture, window treatments, additional power points, etc.

The recommended allowance from RLB for these works is \$20,000.

Category 3 Works

Category 3 works include additional irrigation to the viewing mounds. This was originally deleted from the project scope however for ease of future maintenance and long-term management of the facility it should be re-instated.

The estimated cost of these works is \$40,000. Council will fund these works from existing Operational Budgets.




Additional Funds Required



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



REPORT OBJECTIVE

The purpose of the report is to provide Council with an update on the progress of the Sam Willoughby BMX Facility pump track and to seek Council's direction to fund the budget shortfall to deliver the pump track to Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) standards.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

At 27 July 2021 General Council meeting, Council resolved to proceed with a UCI asphalt pump track. The pump track is being developed as a separable portion proposed to be located to the south of the Sam Willoughby BMX track car park. UCI has confirmed the only UCI accredited track design and construct builder globally is Velosolutions. Council staff have been in discussions with Velosolutions seeking a detailed design and construct proposal. This report provides reference to the procurement process and proposal with noted budget shortfall to achieve a UCI accredited track.

RECOMMENDATION

That Council:

- 1. Resolves to address the shortfall in funding to develop a UCI accredited pump track as through:
 - 1. Additional funding of \$472,000 allocated through Council's 2021/22 Budget



Review process to deliver a UCI accredited pump track at the Sam Willoughby BMX Facility. Noting the timelines to deliver will be post July 2022 due to contractor availability.

Or

2. Seeking a State Government and/or Onkaparinga Council funding contribution of 50% of the costs (\$336,000) to deliver the UCI pump track at the Sam Willoughby BMX Facility. Remaining \$136,000 required to be allocated through Council's 2021/22 Budget Review process. Noting the timelines to deliver will be post July 2022 due to contractor availability.

Or

- 3. Does not allocate or seek additional funds to deliver a UCI pump track and foreshadows a recission motion be brought to a subsequent General Council Meeting by a report from the Chief Executive Officer pursuant to Regulation 21 of the Local Government (Procedures at Meetings) Regulations, to then allow Council to consider alternative options to deliver a pump track.
- 2. In accordance with Section 91(7) and (9) of the Local Government Act 1999 the Council orders that Attachment 2 to this report, BMX Pump Track Procurement, and the financial information within the report, Attachment 1 and the minutes arising from this report having been considered in confidence under Section 90(2) and (3)(k) of the Act, except when required to effect or comply with Council's resolution(s) regarding this matter, be kept confidential and not available for public inspection for a period of 12 months from the date of this meeting. This confidentiality order will be reviewed at the General Council Meeting in December 2022.

DISCUSSION

At the General Council meeting on 27 July 2021 (GC210727M14.2), a recission motion was tabled to change the scope of the pump track at the Sam Willoughby BMX (SWBMX) Facility from a hybrid (dirt and bitumen) track to a bitumen UCI pump track. The motion was brought to Council based on feedback from Minister Speirs, the community, and the Cove BMX club that a bitumen track would be preferred. A budget allocation of \$200,000 was provided within the resolution for the design and construction of the new pump track.

A UCI accredited pump track has the potential to attract World Class Red Bull racing events to Adelaide and would complement the new SWBMX facility.

In 2018, Velosolutions in conjunction with Red Bull launched the first global pump track race series, the Red Bull Pump Track World Championships. In 2019 they joined forces with the Union Cycliste Internationale and became the Red Bull UCI Pump Track World Championships.

The UCI has advised that a UCI pump track can only be delivered by one accredited pump track builder world-wide being Velosolutions. Currently there are no guideline specifications available for UCI accredited track design and construction. Furthermore, there is no defined process for contractor UCI accreditation, limiting the market approach.

Through conversation with Velosolutions we have been advised that there is only one existing UCI accredited pump track within Australia, being in Mount Gambier which recently hosted a world championship qualifier May 2021. There are currently two new facilities being built in New South Wales (Port Macquarie and Camden) and planning for one in Otways, Victoria, which will be UCI accredited. Furthermore, Velosolutions advise that each track is designed for each individual site with unique riding qualities.

A UCI accredited track would support future opportunities to market the site for national and international events including UCI Red Bull and World Championship Qualifiers. This would provide an opportunity to leverage diversity of international and national BMX events



associated to the Sam Willoughby BMX, enhancing the visitor economy.

A Request for Proposal was sent to Velosolutions for the design and construct of the pump track. After numerous attempts for a response, Velosolutions provided two high level options for the construction of a pump track at Majors Road. The designs are representative of what could be achieved (attachment 1). If appointed, Velosolutions will produce new plans to fit the site, the brief and feedback from key stakeholders. A summary of the options is below. Refer to attachment 2 for a summary of the tendered submission and pros and cons of options.

1. Option 1- UCI accredited pump track

UCI track of approx. 210 metres in length and built to specifications as a UCI track. This would be a track that could host UCI events up to World Championship Qualifier.

2. <u>Option 2- Smaller track (not UCI accredited for world championships)- high level</u> estimate price tendered

Smaller pump track of approx. 110 metres in length and built to the same specifications as a UCI track for construction techniques. The track would still be great fun to ride, and pump track events could still run, but not at UCI World Champs Qualifier level.

City of Marion staff sought clarification and review of the proposals for option 1 (accredited track for world championship qualifiers) to ensure provision of geotechnical requirements to the reactive soils was included in scope. Velosolutions sought a quote from a local civil earthworks contractor for soil remediation works to stabilize the subgrade material below the pump track (similar to the works required below the SWBMX track).

Given Velosolution's monopoly in the global pump track market, they are not prepared to share their intellectual property, being the UCI design specifications or guidelines for a pump track with Council. This makes it challenging for Council to seek comparable proposals from other local track builders or to document what Velosolutions would construct as a pump track.

Council staff have sought an alternative contractor pricing for a similar service level (200-210 metres in length, asphalt sealed pump track) to validate the pricing (albeit not UCI accredited). Refer attachment 2 for alternative offer -Option 3.

Based on tendered offers, it has been validated that the UCI accredited track build has significant cost variance to alternative offers of a similar scope, confirming the accreditation and specialised certification does incur a significant premium.

Based on the tendered offers and current Council resolution to implement a UCI accredited pump track, consideration of additional funds is required or a recission motion to review the level of service and UCI standard requirements. If additional funding is not supported a recission motion would foreshadow this report to enable administration to propose alternative options to develop a pump track at the SWBMX site.

Funding

Throughout the design of the SWBMX track, a provisional sum of \$136,000 was prescribed for a future pump track.

At the General Council meeting on 9 February 2021 (GC2102029F07), Council resolved to proceed with detailed design and delivery of the pump track at the SWBMX Facility with expenditure of up to \$136,000 from the SWBMX project contingency in the first instance, with any balance from the Asset and Sustainability Reserve. An additional \$64,000 has been allocated (GC210727M14.2) to support the requirements for soil remediation due to the reactive soils.

The tendered submissions respond to a UCI accredited service provision. The scope of works entails an asphalt track build. Refer to attachment 2 for a summary of the tendered proposals.

With there being a budget shortfall to construct a UCI pump track at the SWBMX due to the soil remediation and track build costs, Council could fund the \$472,000 gap through Council's 2021/22



Budget Review process or seek funding contribution from the State Government and/or City of Onkaparinga (50%) \$336,000 as funding partners for the SWBMX facility with remaining funding shortfall to be allocated from Council's 2021/22 Budget Review process (\$136,000).

Consultation

Council staff understand there is local rider interest in being involved in the design process. Staff acknowledge the importance of local rider knowledge and input to the process and will seek to engage a small stakeholder group in a design review with the engaged contractor.

If Council resolve to proceed with a UCI accredited track there is likely to be limited scope for design modifications to achieve a certified standard compliance.

An alternative service level track design and construct process is likely to provide a more flexible stakeholder design review opportunity.

City of Marion staff will engage with Department Environment and Water as per lease agreement requirements.

It has been confirmed that planning approval is not required for the pump track.

Program

We have been advised that Velosolutions is not available to commence works until June 2022 based on existing work commitments. If Council decides to progress with a UCI accredited track the project delivery will require retiming to post July 2022.

Preliminary design and construct programs tendered by parties illustrate approximately 10-12 weeks. Commencement and completion dates to be negotiated with nominated contractor.

Attachment 2- Summary of Procurement Evaluation - CONFIDENTIAL

 A request for proposal was sent to Velosolutions as the only UCI accredited design and construct pump track builder world-wide.

- Currently there are no documented specifications or guidelines as to UCI accredited track standards. Consequently, it is only through Velosolutions that a track service level can be applied to meet requirements for UCI. We have been informed a 200-210 linear metre track, asphalt sealed is the base requirement with noted construction techniques applied by Velosolutions to which they own the Intellectual Property.
- The request for proposal provided reference to technical geotechnical requirements to ensure the track design and construct accommodates for soil remediation due to reactive soils (similar to the SWBMX track) to mitigate risk of maintenance costs, defects and safety of users.
- Velosolutions is a company based out of the United Kingdom, developing tracks globally. We have been advised they have franchised into Australia with current works primarily in New South Wales and Victoria.
- CoM staff have engaged with Velosolutions on a number of occasions seeking a
 detailed tender response for design and construct of a UCI accredited track. High
 level estimates were originally provided with two options as presented below. Option
 1 accredited track is defined by the linear metre requirements to host a UCI event.
 Option 2 a smaller track could host events but not UCI international world
 championship limiting the future marketability of the precinct.
- CoM staff requested late 2021 for a detailed breakdown of the costs for the proposed UCI accredited track. The scope to include the soil remediation works as prescribed in geotechnical reports. Communications and response from Velosolutions has been challenging, noting they have informed us they have had a number of track build enquiries and busy constructing tracks in NSW.
- Based on the pricing and budget allocation variance, CoM staff sought an offer from
 an alternative local design and construct contractor. The service brief was issued to
 Trailscapes to provide an offer that responded to a similar track level of service (200210 lin/m, asphalt sealed, inclusive of soil remediation). Trailscapes were notified that
 Council has resolved to implement a UCI pump track, consequently the alternative
 offer is subject to a Council resolution being revoked.
- The price check with Trailscapes has provided due diligence to the scope of works requested and market conditions.
- Note an alternative offer could be explored with Trailscapes for a reduced scope reflective of 75-100m track build. Based on a comparative rate of 50% of the 200 linear metre track, this would imply a track build of approximately \$200k within Councils allocated budget. The track would support community recreation opportunities.
