



WARRIPARI STURT RIVER TREE TRAIL

Explore the trail of special trees
along Warripari Sturt River.

Find the tree tags and learn something new!

Walk or cycle the trail and spend
time in the local reserves.

Be intrigued by public art pieces or take
the kids to a playground along the way.

1 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

River red gums are often found along
creeks, rivers or on floodplains.

Find me to the east of the path,
opposite a fork in the trail.

2 EUROPEAN OLIVE

Olea europaea

This gnarly tree was part of the Oaklands
Homestead from the mid 1840's.

Find me to the west of the carpark.

3 ENGLISH OAK

Quercus robur

Enjoy the cool shade on the bench, under the tree.

Find me south of the carpark.

4 CANARY ISLAND PINE

Pinus canariensis

It's glossy pine cones are among the
best for use as Christmas decorations.

Find me to the west of the trail.

5 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

Be amazed by this 500 year old fauna hotel.

Find me on the edge of the old river bed,
near the walking path.

6 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

Beautiful white flowers from late spring to mid-summer.

Find me next to the trail.

7 RIVER RED GUM

Eucalyptus camaldulensis

See the Coolamon scar cut from the tree by Kaurna people.

Find me in the grassy area, in the middle of the ox bow.

8 BLUE ATLAS CEDAR

Cedrus atlantica glauca

Native to the mountains of Morocco and Algeria.

Find me on the bank of the river between the walking trail and the bridge.

9 ENGLISH OAK

Quercus robur

Can live for more than 700 years.

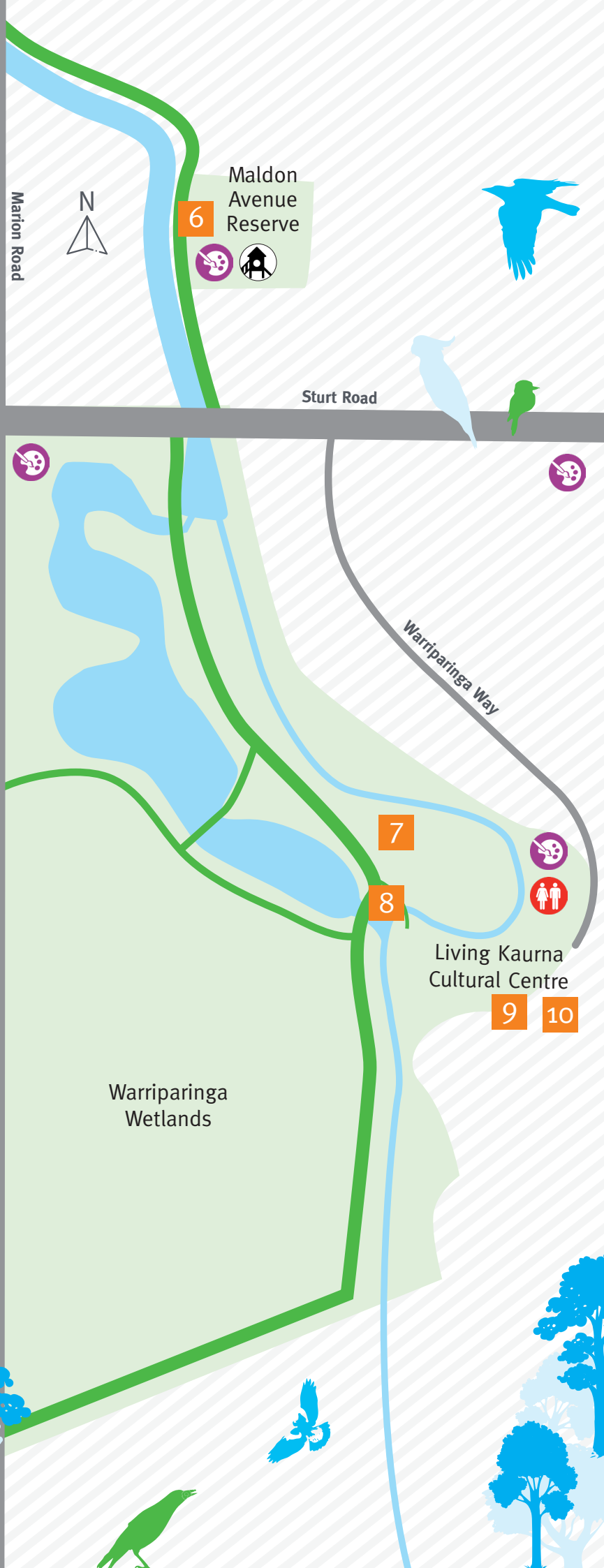
Find me near the grassy area, to the west of Fairford House.









10 LONDON PLANE TREE

Platanus acerifolia

Fuzzy rounded fruiting balls turn from green to brown when ripe.

Find me in the garden behind Fairford House.
